WARD COUNTY FATAL CRASH UPDATE

What: Fatal Crash

Where: Highway 83, MM 175, north of Max

When: Thursday, May 29, 11:15 PM

Road Conditions: Dry

Weather Conditions: Clear, dark

Crash Involvement: Pickup/Pickup pulling a trailer

Type of Crash: Wrong-way, head-on

Agencies Involved: North Dakota Highway Patrol, Ward County Sheriff's Office, Max/Garrison

Ambulance, Max Rural Fire Department

Vehicle No. 1: 2000 Chevrolet Silverado

Driver No. 1: Under Investigation

Restraints: Unknown

Charges: Under investigation

Vehicle No. 2: 2023 Ford F250 towing a 2001 Car Trailer

Driver No. 2: Timothy Goodwin, 31, Williston, serious, non-life-threatening injuries

Restraints: Seatbelt **Charges:** None

Passenger No. 1: Larissa Lake, 30, Williston, serious, non-life-threatening injuries

Restraints: Seatbelt

Passenger No. 2: Juvenile, serious, but non-life-threatening injuries

Restraints: Child restraint device

NARRATIVE: On May 29 at approximately 11:15 PM, a 2000 Chevrolet Silverado was driving north in the southbound lanes of travel on US Highway 83 and had crossed over into Ward



County. At an unknown location the vehicle turned around and began traveling south in the northbound lanes. At mile marker 175, the Silverado struck a 2023 Ford F250 towing a car trailer. The driver of the Silverado died at the scene. The three occupants of the Ford F250 suffered serious, but non-life-threatening injuries and were transported to Trinity Health Hospital, Minot.

The North Dakota Highway Patrol is seeking information about the driver of the 2000 Chevrolet Silverado. The crash remains under investigation by the North Dakota Highway Patrol.
